



DIFFERENT UNITS OF THE CENTRE

• **Electronic Reading Unit:** The Centre is equipped with Text Reading machines, stand alone for non computer users, PC based devices for reading of printed books by the blind, Screen magnification software, video magnifiers for the partially blind and those with low vision, display talking books players for listening to audio books created by the Centre or Sourced from other NGOs. There can be various text books of all classes and various courses on Arts, Commerce, Science, and Management.

• Braille Book Production Unit:

- **Books:** This unit is equipped with 2 embossers or high speed Braille printers, wherein English and Kannada language is translated into Braille language and printed
- Audio CD's: 13 audio CD's on the text books for optional subjects are prepared by the Centre for its distribution to the needy students who do not know Braille language (Appendix 2)
- > **Software:** The Centre has installed a number of software for access of reading material by the students
 - Pearl Instant Open Book Reading and Scanning Software: This has portable reading camera, which scans and reads out to the students;
 - JAWS for Windows Screen Reading Software, which guides the impaired students regarding how they are proceeding with the system;
 - Duxbury Translation Software: This helps converting / translating English and Kannada into Braille language; and
 - Bonita Mouse Magnifier (poor vision reading software)
- Career Counseling / Job Placement Unit: This unit is for providing information on different opportunities that can be pursued by visually challenged students in order to improve their skill and hence employability, based on their aptitude and qualifications.

The Centre in collaboration with the NGO, ENABLE INDIA is organizing a series of program on continuous basis. The thrust of these of programs is in the form of job profiling, computer and employability training, career workshops to create awareness on job market based on the need of the corporate industry, contact classes and finally placement services. (Appendix-3)

This is a unique partnership model, where the educational institution, the NGO and the corporate sector will come together. The Bangalore University Braille Resource Centre will be a catalyst in coordinating these three-tier linkage programs.

• **Financial Aid**: The University has been supporting these students by offering each student a scholarship of Rs. 500/- per month for ten months which is paid in one installment in an academic year. The scholarship offered by the University is of great help as these students come from very poor socio- economic background, without parental care. They stay in hostels run by charitable trusts.

• Infrastructure of the Centre

• Activities of the Centre during 2014-15

- The Centre procured books on Political Science, History, Sociology, Economics, and General English in Braille Language. 50 copies each were distributed to the libraries of 32 colleges for distribution among the visually impaired students.
- ❖ Job profiling was done on 23rd July 2014, where in 15 students participated and are getting on hand training.
- ❖ The second two-day workshop on Career Orientation for the Visually Challenged students was organized on 11th and 12th September 2014. This programme was organized in collaboration with NGO, Enable India and supported by Tech-Mahindra Foundation. During this workshop, 85 students of different affiliated colleges participated. From corporate sector two companies namely, Lake View which deals with medical transcription and Vindya information Pvt. Ltd, participated.
- Five books on Sociology, Kannada, Economics, Environment Science and Political Science were recorded and Audio CDs were prepared.
- ❖ Books of IV, V and VI Semester of History, Kannada, Sociology and Political Science have been translated into Braille language and given to the students.
- From June 2014, onwards the Centre has scanned 50 books on different subjects.
- The third two-day Career Workshop was conducted on 13th and 14th February 2015, in which 52 students from 16 colleges and one PG department took part.





❖ A-day workshop on Disability Awareness for Civil Society was conducted on 4th March 2015. The programme was inaugurated by Smt. Umashree, Hon'ble Minister for Women and Child Development, Empowerment of Disabled and Senior Citizens, and attended by over 150 students and staff of Bangalore University. This event was followed by a cultural programme by the visually impaired students in order to exhibit their talents and abilities to the members of the civil society.

Future Plans

- **Assistive Devices:** Centre plans to purchase some more assistive devices to offer more effective services to these students in their attempt towards higher education, like SARA, which is used to convert hard into soft copy and Pocket Magnifier which will zoom and display on screen etc.
- **Examination Unit:** As the centre has PC's with assistive technology, it can serve as an examination hall with a capacity of 20 students at a time.
- **Distance Education Unit**: Another ambitious program of the centre is to provide distance education by giving online tutorials to students unable to visit the centre. The Unit can also monitor the provision of the study materials in Braille, audio etc. undertake assessment of answer sheets, online or written and conversion of Braille answer sheets to regular text for easy correction by faculty, test taking etc.
- **MOU with NGO:** The Centre has plans of entering into an MOU with ENABLE INDIA (NGO), to have collaborative technical activities to enhance the welfare of visually challenged students.
- **Government Assistance:** The Bangalore University plans to seek help from the Dept. of Children and Women's Welfare, Dept of Health and Family Welfare and the Department of Education, Govt. of Karnataka to expand its horizon for assistive efforts to these students.
- **Tie-Ups:** The Centre plans to tie up with Netralaya and other hospitals with ophthalmology super specialty and Eye Banks to help students with corrective measures to gain vision. The Centre will make concerted effort to get sponsorships from well-established charitable trusts both in India and abroad.

Conclusion

Establishment of a learning resource centre for the visually challenged students will benefit them to have equal opportunity for education, research, training, as well as employment as their sighted peers. This is an important step in attaining social mobility

through "inclusive education". The centre is helping these visually challenged students to develop holistically by extending assistance both in higher education and is pursuing their professional ambitions.
