16.Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

Bangalore University is completely committed to implementation of NEP. The University actively involved in NEP Draft discussion to stakeholder sensitization when the NEP was proposed to implement.

Bangalore University conducted symposium on draft NEP involving Drafting Committee Members and faculty of Bangalore University on June 20th 2019. Bangalore University is the first University to conduct week-long workshop for all stakeholders and implementing authorities. The workshop was conducted online from 24th to 28th August 2020 and with attendance of more than 10,000 participants. Stakeholders like Government of Karnataka (Deputy Chief Minister, Minister of Higher Education and Minister of Primary Education), UGC and AICTE Chairman, Deputy Chairman UGC, Drafting Committee Members, Higher Education Council Vice Chairman GoK, NEP Implementation Taskforce Members, 15 Vice Chancellors, Educational experts, Heads of higher education institutions, Principals and philanthropists etc delivered their views and comments on effective implementation of NEP. Further, Bangalore University conducted series of orientation programmes for affiliated colleges and PG departments on implementation of NEP. Bangalore University faculty were part of High-power Committees to formulate syllabus of different programmes as per NEP. All PG departments supervised and guided all affiliated colleges to counter challenges during implementation by conducting subject-wise orientation. In the process of NEP implementation all PG departments have instituted UG honours course in their respective subjects.

Bangalore University is the first University in the state to establish UG courses inline with NEP. University has started BA, BSc, and BCom courses as per State NEP framework. Further, Bangalore University hosted the South Regional Vice Chancellor's conference to sensitize South Indian states on NEP implementation.

The courses offered in Bangalore University based on NEP framework is truly multidisciplinary and Interdisciplinary, as students of UG programmes are allowed to take core and open elective courses across disciplines such as Arts, Science, commerce, Management and Engineering.

17.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

Bangalore University has facilitated the students with multiple exit and multiple entry. Thus it is adhering to the objective of NEP. University has made all the academic reforms with respect to policy and provision to create Academic bank of credit. Students of Bangalore University is allowed to use the flexibility provided in its statutes. The course framework created in all subjects clearly mentioned the multiple exits with proper certification and flexibility in attaining the course credits.

18.Skill development:

The programme structure adopted in Arts, Science, Commerce, management and engineering has the set of skill based and ability enhancement courses. Students at every semester has the provision to take compulsory skill enhancement courses. Further the core subjects are drafted in such way to focus on employability, life skill and technical skills.

19.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

Bangalore University with its mission to foster and teach Indian knowledge system has established many study centres and chairs along with specialized UG and PG courses. The concerns of India and Indian knowledge systems will deeply inform all the knowledge endeavours of the University including teaching, research and practice. University has M.Sc. course in Human consciousness and Yoga, M.A in Dance, Classical Music, courses in Gandhian Studies, Ambedkar Studies, Buddhist literature, Kannada literature, Vivekananda studies ect. It has identified research centres to foster Indian Knowledge system.

20.Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

Bangalore University has implemented NEP from academic year 2021-22. All the courses are designed with specific course outcomes. Syllabus is structured to address the current and future requirements. Each course has course objectives and course specific outcome. Further after one year of completion a student can exit with certificate course. After two years student can exit with diploma certificate. After 3 years with degree certificate. The syllabus clearly spell out the job opportunities after every exit. Thus all the courses are out one based. The academic flexibility provided in course selection and accumulation of credits. The ability enhancement courses such as digital fluency, entrepreneurship development are aimed to improve the capacity building of students.

Bangalore University has secured 64th position in NIRF thus it has the provision to start online classes. University is working towards it. Bangalore University was offering distance education in Arts, commerce and education descipline.

(Honours) in Physical Science, B.A. (Honours) in Liberal Arts.Bangalore is the hub of various professional possibilities.Further traditional courses are updated with latest skill and knowledge generation objectives.Further university has

started under graduate honors courses with multiple entry and multiple exit options and National Education Policy guidelines. Under NEP university has initiated new under graduate subjects based on professional and skill requirements.

Concise NEP-2020 recognition training programmes were conducted for faculties of affiliated colleges and university staff. Every curriculum includes discussions about professional ethics. The university makes an effort to observe significant national and international days, such as International Women's Day, Human Rights Day, and International Yoga Day, National Science Day, International Science Day, World Meteorological Day, Earth day, Ozone day, Biodiversity Day, constitution day, among others, by organizing seminars and workshops throughout all postgraduate programmes that address the themes of these days.

Students may take support from the university's Anti Sexual Harassment unit, which also works to advance gender equality and ensure the safety of women in the university's administration, teaching staff, and support personnel. Several levels of protection, including surveillance cameras, keep students safe on campus. A separate boys' and girls' hostel on campus ensures everyone feels secure.

2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

2.2.1 - The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organises special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

The university has well-planned multi-level strategies that are implemented from time to time to address the issues of learning levels. Mentoring is implemented at under-graduate and post-graduate level. Students are assigned with a teacher and senior students to get the academic support and speedup the learning. The induction training program conducted immediately after the admission. The orientation programmes are conducted to provide basic understanding of the subject, professional possibilities and knowledge of skill requirements by the eminent academicians and professionals. Alumni are involved in motivating students.

The actual stratification of students into slow, average and advanced learners is based on their performance in the internal examination. Undergraduate courses are effectively implementing the mentorship and segregation of students into different learning

levels. Teaching faculty, course coordinator and Head of the department take up the responsibilities of providing necessary guidance. Special remedial classes are arranged for the slow learners before or beyond the regular class schedule on specific days for each course and individual attention is paid for improving the students' level of learning, problem solving and presentation.

Simultaneously, the needs of the average, progressive and advanced learners are taken care of by the concerned faculty through assignments, seminars, and peer-group discussions.

2.3.1 - Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem-solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences

Experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are well adopted to ensure the holistic development of students and facilitate life-long learning and knowledge management.

Various courses offered at constituent colleges and Post graduate departments have incorporated participatory learning based on the demand of understanding the subjects. Students are allowed to participate in various training programmes by conducting special hands on training sessions and department level. To enhance the participative learning, seminars, projects and model making are encouraged.

Participation in professional societal activities of IEEE, ACM, etc.

for engineering, moot court for law and other relevant professional organizations activities along with Soft skill training.

Industry interaction and the internships are made mandatory for the students. Social work, women studies, education students do regular field work and extension activities for experiential learning.

Industry projects and collaborations are undertaken to enrich students with pre-employment training. Periodical Guest lectures on topics relevant to employment skills by personnel from respective organizations/industry.

Experiential learning is ensured also through practical courses, encouraging students to take up innovative projects. Involving students in teacher's research work, organizing exhibitions etc.

Problem solving methodologies are adopted at every semester by incorporating quizzes, case study analysis, seminars and focus group discussions.

All the faculty of Bangalore University have regularly taken online classes without compromising with curriculum requirements. Online live classes, discussions, demonstrations; project monitoring and practical orientation was given to the students extensively during this year. All the teachers are technically equipped the skills of handling various online platforms, learning management systems and tapping online resources. Teachers used MOODLE, Insert learning, Wakelet, Flip grid, Google classroom, Zoom, Google meet, Microsoft teams etc. Teachers have prepared video lectures, interactive slides and other activities to enhance the student engagement. Faculty have been provided with demonstrations and training to handle online classes. Even after resuming offline classes faculty are engaged with students learning through online platforms such as uploading the assignments, group discussions, online tests, interactions, discussions, sharing materials etc.

ICT enabled Teaching-Learning Process is supported with Regular Practical Sessions, access to Digital Library, Online Courses (MOOCS, NPTEL etc.), online journals, Online tests, Use of LCD

projectors for seminars and workshops, productive use of educational videos, and accessibility of non-print material for students of different disciplines. Faculty and students find ICT tools indispensable for teaching.

Bangalore University is uploading marks cards, degree certificates to NAD which enables the students to download their marks cards and degree certificates. It helps in the verification, authentication and genuineness of the marks cards and degree certificates anywhere in the world. Uploading the Internal Assessment marks though online is made mandatorily before downloading the hall ticket. Bangalore University has launched digital evaluation undergraduate. The teachers who have involved in the process have expressed their happiness by appreciating the advantages of the system.

Digital valuation system has contributed to hassle free, efficient and time saving evaluation in the university. Digital valuation has improved the quality of valuation. With the digitization quick retrieval of answer script for reevaluation purpose is made possible and the answer script is sent to the student's email once they pay reevaluation fees. Provision for digital signature as made the issuance of certificate full proof. The disbursement of remuneration also digitized. Digital evaluation centers are established in affiliated colleges. The University is moving towards paper less, hassle free, efficient and non corrupt system.

2.6 - Student Performance and Learning Outcomes

2.6.1 - The institution has stated learning outcomes (generic and programme specific)/graduate attributes which are integrated into the assessment process and widely publicized through the website and other documents

The Program Outcomes (POs), Program Specific Outcomes (PSOs) and

Course Outcomes (COs) are framed by the department after rigorous consultation with all faculty and the stakeholders. These Pos and PSOs are formulated based on the students ability and skill enhance requirements to fulfill the professional and personal requirements. Program specific objectives are also in compliance with expectations of respective professional bodies of the program such as UGC, AICTE etc. The syllabus, which has the incorporation of the programme objectives, program specific objectives and course objectives are displayed on the university websites and syllabus books of the respective programs. Each course has a defined set of course outcomes and corresponding evaluation criteria. The course outcomes are mapped to the program outcomes which are used to provide the quantitative measurement of how well the program outcomes are achieved. The performance of the students in the examinations during the semester in each course is used to compute the level of attainment of the POs and PSOs through the mapping of questions to COs and COs to POs and PSOs. CO-PO & PSO mapping for all the courses in the program is prepared by the Board of studies in consultation with faculty members. The undergraduate course syllabus is prepared as per the requirements of National Education Policy implementation. Therefore all the courses have explicitly mapped the graduate attributes and correspondingly prepared course objectives and course outcomes. Further all postgraduate programs have been evaluated based on the course objectives and attributes. Equal weightage for CIE and SEE is given. Graduate attribute mapping is done for every subject taught at undergraduate level. Students' feedback is taken on regular intervals. Course outcomes are mapped to appropriate program outcomes and program specific outcomes through course and program articulation matrices.

6.2 - Strategy Development and Deployment

6.2.1 - The institutional Strategic plan is effectively deployed

The multidisciplinary fabric of Bangalore University, the STEM ecosystem, and employment opportunities of Bangalore places it as the most suitable destination to kick start the multidisciplinary four years undergraduate honors curriculum in Liberal Arts and Liberal Science along with its pre-existing popular four years undergraduate program in Life Sciences. Bangalore University is the first public university to begin its undergraduate program under NEP from December 2021. Under NEP, there is a shift from teacher-focused to learner-focused activities, i.e., from passive to participatory pedagogies characterized by flexibility in the system via Multiple-entry and Multiple-exit (1st year- Certificate, 2nd year- Diploma, 3rd year- Degree). The system facilitates the Continuation of education from the same level in any University/College through Academic Credit Bank. The student will complete graduation in 3 years. The optional 4th year is for Honours Degree, and if they complete the fourth year with Research, they will be directly eligible for Ph.D. Internship and Entrepreneurship are made a mandatory component of the curriculum.

Bangalore University along with UGC guidelines issued from time to time, follow Karnataka Universities Act (2000), Bangalore University Statutes in the matter of appointment and service rules. Every year both teaching and nonteaching faculties who are permanent positions are expected to submit annual appraisal reports with documentation. Recruitment and promotions for teaching faculties happen in four ways.

Career Advancement Scheme (CAS): Every year on the basis of ratified UGC guidelines BU calls for application for in-service promotions for Assistant Professors, Associate Professors, and Professors. Qualified candidates submit their applications and the respective dean and IQAC director conduct the scrutiny. Eligible candidates appear before the screening/ Selection committee duly formed following UGC norms.

Appointment of Guest faculty: Every year at the beginning of the academic year BU calls for the Guest faculty positions on the basis of the requirement put forth by respective departments through open advertisement in the News Papers. Selection criteria conform UGC API

The university has well-planned multi-level strategies that are implemented from time to time to address the issues of learning levels. Mentoring is implemented at under-graduate and post-graduate level. Students are assigned with a teacher and senior students to get the academic support and speedup the learning. The induction training program conducted immediately after the admission. The orientation programmes are conducted to provide basic understanding of the subject, professional possibilities and knowledge of skill requirements by the eminent academicians and professionals. Alumni are involved in motivating students.

The actual stratification of students into slow, average and advanced learners is based on their performance in the internal examination. Undergraduate courses are effectively implementing the mentorship and segregation of students into different learning levels. Teaching faculty, course coordinator and Head of the department take up the responsibilities of providing necessary guidance. Special remedial classes are arranged for the slow learners before or beyond the regular class schedule on specific days for each course and individual attention is paid for improving the students' level of learning, problem solving and presentation.

Online Distribution of evaluation centers and in-house scanning of answer scripts have eliminated malpractice. The two-decade problem of non-issue of marks cards for not uploading of internal assessment marks by the colleges has been solved by mandatorily uploading the IA marks online before downloading the hall ticket. Implementation of online Batch making for practical examination, online Examiner's allotment, online marks captured for UG/PG Practical Examinations has brought lots of transparency in the process of evaluation. For theory examinations, Room allotment, Invigilation dairy, packing details are all provided online. Marks cards/ certificates are issued to the students soon after examinations results. This process of transparency and faster delivery made acquiring knowledge more inclusive.

6.2 - Strategy Development and Deployment

6.2.1 - The institutional Strategic plan is effectively deployed

The multidisciplinary fabric of Bangalore University, the STEM ecosystem, and employment opportunities of Bangalore places it as the most suitable destination to kick start the multidisciplinary four years undergraduate honors curriculum in Liberal Arts and Liberal Science along with its pre-existing popular four years undergraduate program in Life Sciences. Bangalore University is the first public university to begin its undergraduate program under NEP from December 2021. Under NEP, there is a shift from teacher-focused to learner-focused activities, i.e., from passive to participatory pedagogies characterized by flexibility in the system via Multiple -entry and Multiple -exit (1st year- Certificate, 2nd year- Diploma, 3rd year- Degree). The system facilitates the Continuation of education from the same level in any University/College through Academic Credit Bank. The student will complete graduation in 3 years. The optional 4th year is for Honours Degree, and if they complete the fourth year with Research, they will be directly eligible for Ph.D. Internship and Entrepreneurship are made a mandatory component of the curriculum.

Every year both teaching and nonteaching faculties who are permanent positions are expected to submit annual appraisal reports with documentation. Recruitment and promotions for teaching faculties happen in four ways.

Career Advancement Scheme (CAS): Every year on the basis of ratified UGC guidelines BU calls for application for in-service promotions for Assistant Professors, Associate Professors, and Professors. Qualified candidates submit their applications and the respective dean and IQAC director conduct the scrutiny. Eligible candidates appear before the screening/ Selection committee duly formed following UGC norms.

Appointment of Guest faculty: Every year at the beginning of the academic year BU calls for the Guest faculty positions on the basis of the requirement put forth by respective departments through open advertisement in the News Papers. Selection criteria conform UGC API system. After initial scrutiny by the departmental HOD eligible candidates appear before the selection committee comprising of the Vice-chancellor, Dean, and HOD of the respective Departments. Candidates are selected on the basis of API score (out of 87.5) interview marks (out of 12.5). Social inclusivity is taken care of during the process of selection.

7.2 - Best Practices

7.2.1 - Describe one best practice successfully implemented by the Institution as per NAAC format provided in the Manual

The major land use of Bangalore University consists of biopark, open land, roads of university campus and rooftop area of departments. Biopark consist of 192.23 ha, open land consists of 115.56 ha and roads of university campus consist of 8.343 ha area. There are 131 buildings on the campus, of which 29 buildings have rooftop area of more than 1000 m²; 92 buildings less than 500 m²; 10 buildings are between 500 to 1000 m². All put together it will add upto an area of 24.18 ha. The total average rainwater potential of the campus is found to be 15,45,425.25 m³. There are presently 5 check dams in campus

giving scope for harvesting surface water as well as groundwater, one check dam is under construction at Gandhi Bhavan and 17 check dams are proposed; expecting a raise of 2m of water table in campus. Bangalore University has been awarded the 'Jalarushi Puraaskar-2020' award for the implementation of water conservation techniques, Rainwater harvesting and reuse of treated wastewater to encourage consumers and inspire others about proper conservation and efficient water usage.

7.3 - Institutional Distinctiveness

7.3.1 - Highlight the performance of the institution in an area distinct to its priority and thrust (within a maximum of 200 words)

University acting as a lung space in the urban setting by having unique urban forest. The green space of the campus with a wide range of biodiversity, witnessing the rich flora, faunal species including wide varieties of birds, butterflies, reptiles etc, thus acting as a field laboratory, resulted in number of research works by students and scholars.

At the initial stage of plantation, 800 acres of biodiversity conservation area is divided into 9 sectors based on slope, drainage and edaphic factor and demarked for biodiversity conservation area in 1998.

Further, in the recent years the current conservation programme was undertaken with the objective of conserving native and endemic species by intermixing with a pool of evergreen, moist deciduous and deciduous fast-growing species so as to encourage the regeneration of native herbs, grasses and shrubs in the region. This would pave way for eliminating weeds from the ex-situ park which in turn would reduce runoff, increase infiltration, soil quality and microclimate. The overall goal of the Bio-park is to improve the quality environment, clear air, water and aesthetic values. In addition, the migration and breeding of birds and animals including insects and butterflies could be a strategic outcome of the programme

7.3.2 - Plan of action for the next academic year

University plans to offer various multidisciplinary and Interdisciplinary UG programmes on campus based on the NEP framework. University also encourages mono disciplinary affiliated colleges to become multidisciplinary institution under the guidance

of IQAC and CDC. Institution also has made preparations for introduction of skill courses aligned to NSFQ guidelines. University department will be encouraged to start MOOC Programmes on SWAYAM, NPTEL and any such Government Initiative. Academic Council will be encouraged to make provisions for project based course in Humanities, embed apprenticeship in degree programmes.
