## Internship/Apprenticeship and Viva Voce for 6th Semester BSc Honours:

An internship/apprenticeship is a short-term work experience/experiential learning/hands-on experience offered by institutions/organizations/government establishments/MNCs to students for up to 3 to 4 weeks, aimed at providing entry-level exposure to a particular field.

The primary goal of an internship/apprenticeship is to gain practical work experience, often required as part of the curriculum for the BSc Honours program. Internships are typically completed during the sixth semester, though they may also be undertaken at the end of the fifth semester during vacation periods.

Internship/apprenticeship credits are earned in the sixth semester of the BSc program, with a total of 2 credits allocated for the internship, carrying 100 marks. Upon completion, an internship report, meeting all necessary requirements and possibly reviewed by the staff-in-charge, must be submitted to the Department Head/Principal within the stipulated timeframe announced by the Department/College. Viva voce, or oral examination, will be conducted at the end of the semester.

Internal assessment marks will be posted on the notice board of the department/college for the students' information. There is no specified minimum requirement for internal assessment marks.
